


CAMPUS HOUSING: NAHOONAI-A

Nahoonai-a: "To find" or "To rediscover" Named by Lheidli T'enneh First Nation Elder Josie Paul, the building is called Nahoonai-a, which means "to find" or "to rediscover." Nahoohai-a is designed as a culturally safe, supportive, traditional community experience for Indigenous students. Students may stay in Nahoonai-a for a maximum of one year. After that, students may apply to the Main Building.



GET HIELP PAYING FOR COLLEGE

Education should be accessible for everyone, and you shouldn't have to worry about finances while you study. Financial Aid and Awards is available to all CNC students, because everyone needs a little extra help during college.



STUDENT LOANS

Full-time loans are available for students enroled in a minimum of 3 courses (or 9 credits). Part-time loans are available to students studying less than 3 courses (8 credits or less). We offer consultation on student loan issues and can assist with your application for financial assistance.



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EMERGENCY LOANS

Emergency loans are available to students who are experiencing unforeseen financial emergency situations. If you are a current student who is experiencing emergency financial hardship, you may be eligible to apply for CNC Emergency Funding.

AWARDS

Scholarships and bursaries are awarded based on academic achievement, and on financial need. Unlike loans, these do not need to be repaid.

SCHOLARSHIPS

A scholarship is a financial award granted based on academic achievement. Depending on the scholarship, there may be a minimum GPA requirement. Most scholarships must be applied to by a specified deadline.



BURSARIES

A bursary is a financial award granted based on financial need. Students who are using loans or band funding may still apply to receive a bursary. Most bursaries must be applied to by a specified deadline.

ENTRANCE SCHOLARSHIPS

Entrance Scholarships are available for students to apply to immediately after being accepted into a program at CNC. You could receive up to \$2,000 before you even step on campus by applying to one of our entrance scholarships.







SAFETY ALERTS & RADAR

Safety Alerts & Safety Radars are used to share the outcomes of incident investigations and provide a reminder of possible hazards so you can avoid future incidents.
