

CNC Press publishes compilation of Prince George news articles

Local history enthusiast and author Valerie Giles has published "Remembering...", a celebration of Prince George's storied past, as told in articles written by Giles for her column in the Prince George Citizen from 1998-2009. The book comes out just in time for Prince George's centennial anniversary and comprises over 560 articles about landmark moments in the city's history. Giles, who holds a doctorate in political and administrative history, believes strongly in the importance of recording and learning from the past.

"I am grateful to the succession of [Prince George Citizen] editors who valued having a window on the past," Giles wrote in her acknowledgements. "The fascinating people who came to make their lives here deserve to be recognized,"

The book, published by CNC Press, covers a broad range of stories from our city's origins and throughout the last century. The articles cover topics such as Prince George's wartime history, distinguished citizens and industry development, as well as more offbeat subjects like early-century fashion and abandoned plans for a downtown monorail.

"Remembering..." launches this Friday, March 6, where Dr. Giles will be signing copies from 2:00 on at Books & Company.

Members of the 100th anniversary committee fanned out across the city, speaking at public gatherings, to service clubs, community groups and gathering

A 2013 public input process gathered upwards of 350 suggestions, many of which have been incorporated in some way into the year's plans, said Krause. Out of those recommendations, two

main themes emerged: to celebrate the city's history and, more importantly, to

simply celebrate.
"There are some wonderful things that came our way," said Krause.
'Instilled in the work of the committee was the real desire to create more community pride. We have come a long ways. And one of things we've talked about a lor in many circles as a talked about a lot, in many circles as we've talked about the celebration, we've talked about the celebration, was encouraging people not to be so self denigrating – that we really are an incredible community. We're hoping, of course, that just coming off the Games, people will have that sense of pride."

The committee, which received a budget of \$100,000 from the city and an additional \$72,700 in federal funds, was able to provide \$25,000 in micro grants.

At 2 p.m. Friday, local historian Valerie Giles will launch her new book, Remembering..., at Books and Company.
The book, published by CNC Press, is a collection of more than 560 columns on the city's history that Giles wrote between February 1998 and January 2009 in the Prince George Citizen.
The approximately 600-page book took about a year to compile, said CNC Press manager Kathy Plett. There are also about 270 historical photos dug up by The Exploration Place staff.
"The city's success appears to be clear-

"The city's success appears to be clear-ly based on the quality of its citizens and it's nice to have a chance to feature some of them in this publication," Plett said in the book's introduction.

The official anniversary date will be capped off with the Mayor's Volunteer Banquet at the Civic Centre Friday night.



June 17, 2015 – Centennial: Prince George Celebrates 100 years

The following is an abridged version of a May 2008 Prince George Citizen article, which was republished by CNC Press in Dr. Valerie Giles' 2015 book "Remembering... A celebration of Prince George's storied past". A full version can be found in this new book.

Sacred Heart Cathedral celebrates 40 years as a diocese and cathedral church on June 5, 2008. Roman Catholic presence in British Columbia dates back to the early 1800's through the work of the missionary Oblates of Mary Immaculate.

The first to visit Fort George was father Modeste Demers, who arrived from Fort Vancouver in 1842 traveling with the Hudson Bay caravan.

Bring the sacraments and the pastoral services to the people was sporadic and infrequent until the settlement at Fort George grew to the point where a church was needed.

The earliest regular Roman Catholic Masses were offered by Father Nicolas Coccola in 1912. With no church yet constructed, the faithful gathered at Birch's Hall in South Fort George. Two years later in 1914, conditions improved with the arrival of Father L. Rivet on August 12th. He got construction underway and the first Roman Catholic Church, located south of the Millar addition, was blessed on September 27th.

Within a decade, the growing population required a larger church to replace the first simple building. The site chosen was the corner of Patricia Avenue and Ontario Street (which has since been re-named Ingledew). That building was consecrated by Bishop Bunoz of Sacred Heart Church on Christmas Eve 1924. Surviving photographs show the design as a simple roofline fronted with a turret-topped tower at the entrance with a rose window over the main door and round-topped Gothic-style windows shaped "like fingers pointing to Heaven." That white wooden –clad structure remained in use for six decades. It served as a Roman Catholic parish until 1959 when it was sold to the Orthodox Catholics. That congregation moved it to the corner of Seventh Avenue and Brunswick where it was used until 1985.

Prince George Architect Trelle Morrow was contracted in 1958 to design the parish hall for Sacred Heart Church and again in 1961 to design a new church building at 887 Patricia Boulevard. It certainly met the criteria for modern design of its day. Morrow recalls, "That was an interesting building...laminated timber was very popular... and that particular structural system is what's called a two-hinged arch."

Sacred Heart Church was consecrated to the service of God on April 15, 1961 by Bishop Fergus O'Grady, then Bishop of Prince Rupert. The High Mass was followed by a formal banquet attended by Archbishop Grace Jordan from Edmonton, Mayor Garvin Dezell, architect Trelle Morrow, and representatives from Narod Construction.

This abridged 2008 article is an example of the growth of the Roman Catholic Church in Prince George. For the City's 100th Anniversary, Sacred Heart Parish is celebrating 100 years of growing together. On June 28th they invite the community to a BBQ. This annual potluck event has the Parish providing meat while participants are encouraged to contribute salads, desserts or finger food. There will also be balloons popcorn, cotton candy and games starting at 5:30pm.


