## INTRODUCTION

This index is to be used in conjunction with the early Prince George newspapers which preceed April 1923.

The earliest newspaper available is the Fort George Times which began publication in 1909 and ran until 1915, the Fort George Herald from 1910-1913, the Prince George Post from 1914-1915, the Prince George Star from 1916-1917 and the Prince George Leader from 1921-1923. Included among these newspapers are the Fort George Times and the Prince George Herald which are not available in the College of New Caledonia Resource Centre.

These newspapers have been microfilmed and are available for public use at the College of New Caledonia Resource Centre. They provide the reader with an indepth idea of the life and times of an early Western town as seen through the eyes of sometimes quite biased writers. All major town events are included in this index with the exception of the town's incorporation which occurred at a time at which the newspaper is missing.

The index covers the period 1909-1917 and 1921-1923, although gaps in the microfilmed newspapers hampered a complete index.

To aid the researcher all major subjects found in the newspapers were extracted and indexed in alphabetical order.

## SUBJECT INDEX

The Subject Index covers all major issues and events referred to in the available newspapers from, 1909 to 1917 and 1921 to 1923.

**SUBJECT:** broad category of topic (i.e. PRINCE GEORGE - CROPS).

**YEAR:** the year during which the topic took place.

**DESCRIPTION:** the Month and Day of the newspaper in which the topic was discussed.  
AND  
a further narrowing down of the topic using either key sentences from the stories or the actual headlines from the stories.

**FORMAT:** the method used to indicate the day, month, year and page of a particular article.  
With the example:

the first set of letters indicate the newspaper from which the story was extracted.  
the first set of numbers indicate the month.  
the second set of numbers indicate the day.  
the third set of numbers indicate the year.  
the last set of letters and numbers indicate the page in the newspaper on which the story occurs.
