**Donate your scrubs to support a future health professional**

PRINCE GEORGE – The new school year brings another opportunity for health care professionals in Prince George to help a CNC student pay for his or her education its biannual scrub drive.

On September 28, CNC Health Sciences will be selling donated scrubs for \$5 each with all money raised going towards the “Making a Difference” bursary benefitting health sciences students in need.

“The scrubs are really affordable and anyone – students or community members – can buy them,” said organizer and CNC nursing instructor Nancy Esopenko.

Every year, CNC awards at least five ‘Making a Difference’ bursaries of \$250 each to health science students in need.

To date, CNC’s biannual scrub sales have raised more than \$10,000.

“This bursary has made a huge difference for our students,” said organizer and CNC nursing instructor Nancy Esopenko.” “To date 37 Health Sciences students have received bursaries and more than 2,000 scrubs are in the hands of students.”

The scrubs sale will be on September 28th from 10 a.m. to 3 p.m. at the Gathering Place in the main building in CNC’s Prince George Campus. Donations of gently used scrubs are graciously accepted at the CNC Library or Spirit of the North Health Care Foundation office at UHNBC.
