CNC hosts Board of Governors regular meeting in Prince George

The College of New Caledonia (CNC) hosted its second Board of Governors meeting of the 2018/19 academic year at its Prince George campus on Nov. 30, 2018.

The Board approved a two per cent domestic tuition and mandatory fees increase for the 2019/2020 academic year. The Board also approved a motion that funds from the two per cent increase be put directly towards the support and development of students.

A report released by the provincial government, found at <https://www2.gov.bc.ca/gov/content/education-training/post-secondary-education/data-research/cost-of-post-secondary-education>, shows a two per cent annual increase for domestic tuition is standard for colleges in British Columbia.

“CNC remains the second lowest tuition at a BC college for a full-time academic arts program student,” said CNC President Henry Reiser

CNC Board Chair Gil Malfair provided the Board with an update on the status of CNC’s presidential search.

Since CNC President Henry Reiser announced his plans to retire at the end of his term in June 2019, a Presidential Search Committee has formed and held its first meeting on Nov. 9, 2018.
