This course examines the basic fundamentals of medical terminology in both the written and the spoken forms. You will learn the different medical word parts and word-building skills that will aid in understanding medical terminology and anatomical relations. You will also learn the various terms used to describe or identify diseases, disorders, medical procedures, and abnormalities, as well as the use of appropriate medical abbreviations.
