

Professional Drivers Program

Course Overview

This fully funded seventeen-week program is designed to teach students Class 1 Driver Training, essential skills training and theory, and industry certificates such as WHMIS, OFA level 1 and Transportation of Dangerous Goods.

The program is comprised of a blend of classroom, practical training, work experience and a mentorship.

Entrance Requirements

- Minimum 19 years of age
- El Eligible (WorkBC will verify eligibility)
- Minimum Grade 10 with grade 12 or equivalent preferred.
- Class 5 Driver's License
- Must provide a copy of a current BC driver's abstract (max. 30 days old) with no more than six (6) demerit points and no impaired or other alcohol related convictions in previous 5 years.
- Must provide copy of current accident report
- Must be able to pass an ICBC medical (including vision test)
- Practical driving training will be in Vanderhoof. Students will need to have own transportation.

Fees

The program is being funded through an agreement between the College of New Caledonia and the Government of Canada and the Province of British Columbia's Project Based Labor Market Training.

Did you know?

Students will undergo a four-week workplace mentorship with BC Forest Safety Council trained mentors. Mentors help students develop their skills, learn safe work procedures, and establish relationships that will increase the opportunity for employment upon completion of the program.
