

Job Readiness: Introduction to Sustainable Food Production

Course Overview

TUITION FREE

Through this course students will develop essential employment skills through an introduction to local, sustainable, small-scale food production for Northern ecosystems (zone 4 b), with an emphasis on Indigenous food systems. Using an experiential learning design, students will examine alternative food systems and will compare the benefits and consequences of local food production. Using the CNC greenhouse as a place of fertile learning, students will develop “Skills for Success” alongside time management, safe handling of materials and reciprocity.

In addition, students will develop Individual Learning Plans and do weekly reflections, improve their resume and interview skills, develop cultural agility and have an orientation to CNC’s academic programs.
