Snowmobile up Morfee Mountain to "touch the clouds" and take in amazing lake views.

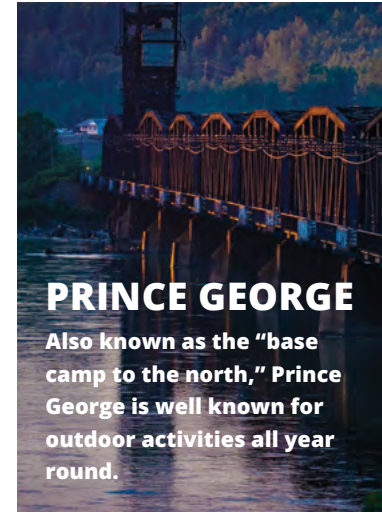

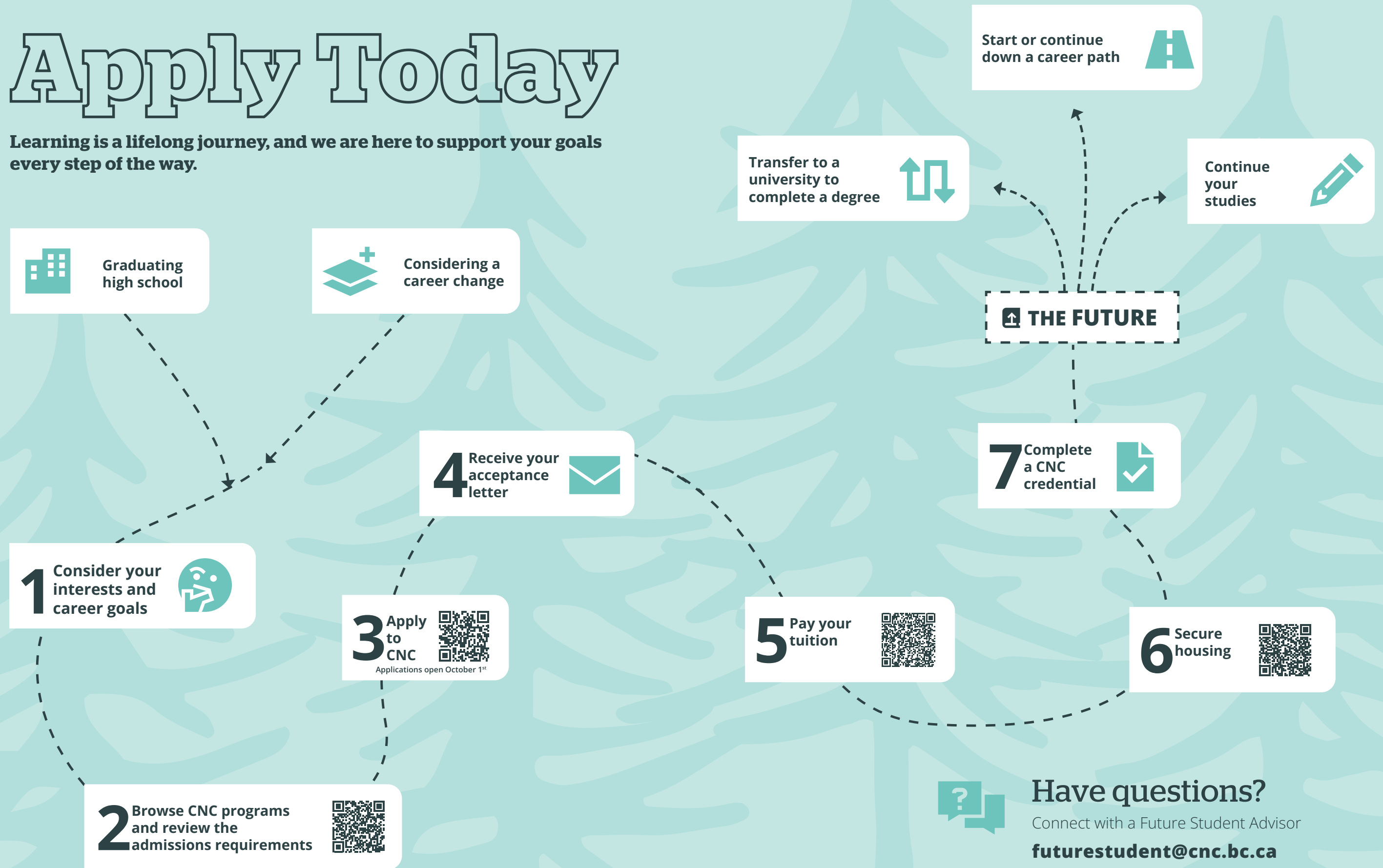

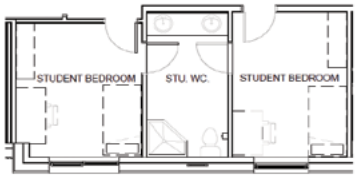

NAHOONAI-A

Indigenous Student Housing

Named by Lheidli T'enneh First Nation Elder Josie Paul, the building is called Nahoonai-a, which means "to find" or "to rediscover." Nahoonai-a is designed as a culturally safe, supportive, traditional community experience for Indigenous students. Students may stay in Nahoonai-a for a maximum of one year. After that, students may apply to the Main Building.
