What is the Student Readiness Assessment?

The Student Readiness Assessment is based on the CAT4 test. CAT4 stands for the Canadian Achievement Test 4. The CAT4 is used to determine a student's learning stage in math and language skills in relation to Canadian school curricula. You will be studying for the level 20-22 version of the test which assesses how well you meet the requirements in the Canadian high school grades 10-12 and above.

The version of the CAT4 test that you will be taking to test your language skills consists of multiple choice questions. The language skills test is divided into five topics: Informational Reading, Literary Reading (N/A), Vocabulary, Writing Conventions, and Spelling.

Test 1: Information Reading

You will read five passages and answer multiple-choice questions. You have 50 minutes to answer the 40 questions in this part of the test.

Here is an example of a question from the Informational Reading section:

The official formation of the Aboriginal Nurses Association of Canada (ANAC) was in 1975. However, its origins precede this historic date by one year. In 1974 the groundwork was started for the actual formation of the association by several nurses who shared a common vision founded in their unique perspective as Aboriginal care givers to Aboriginal people.

Question:

According to the passage, the nurses who started the groundwork for the ANAC had a unique perspective because of their

A. youth. B. friendship. C. medical training. D. Aboriginal origin.
