Admission Requirements

- 1 The Dental Hygiene Diploma program requires the student to complete one full year of University Level Science, with no less than a "B" average or a GPA of 3.0, in order to qualify for the Dental Hygiene Diploma program. The first year university transfer courses have the following admission requirements:
- Successful completion of Grade 12 or equivalent with the following courses at a minimum "C" grade or equivalent: English 12, Biology 12, Chemistry 11 or *Chemistry 12, Math 11 or *Math 12 *depends on which Chemistry stream the student is taking.
- 3 Minimum TOEFL score of 80 (IBT) or minimum overall Academic IELTS score of 6.0 or equivalent, or completion of Level 4 - English for Academic Purposes in the CNC English Language Training program.
- 4 The first year University Transfer classes which are pre-requisites for the Dental Hygiene program are as follows:
 - Biology 111 and 112 or Biology 107 and Bio 130;
 - Chemistry 111 and 112 or Chemistry 113 and 114;
 - Psychology 101 and 102;
 - · English 103 plus another English;
 - Math 104 or Psychology 201 (Stats courses);
 - And one additional elective.
