Program Overview

The Culinary Arts Diploma is a two year program that trains and educates students in the culinary arts and food service industry. Students will use the College of New Caledonia's professional cooking, teaching and learning facilities, which includes a fine dining restaurant, preparing them for successful entry into the workforce. Qualified professional employees in this industry are in high demand as the food service and hospitality sector is projected to create 3300 new jobs in British Columbia in the next 10 years.

This diploma program supports international students wishing to study and work in Canada. The practicum provides an opportunity to introduce students to the food service and hospitality industry, and apply the knowledge and skills learned at CNC to a professional work environment.

Upon graduation from the program, students are encouraged to continue to obtain the necessary work hours required to challenge the Industrial Training Authorities Professional Cook Certification at Level 1 and 2.

Admission Requirements

Applicants require proof of successful completion of the following:

- 1 4 credits of English Language Arts 10, or ENGL 030, or equivalent
- 2 Workplace Mathematics 10, or equivalent
- 3 International students from a non-English speaking country will be required to provide proof of an academic IELTS of 6.0 overall with no band less than 5.5, or equivalent, within the last two years. Students from a country identified on our Exempt Countries list do not have to provide an English Language assessment: cnc.bc.ca/exempt-countries

Program Requirements

- 1 Foodsafe Level 1 is required to be successfully completed in the first 3 weeks of the program.
- 2 BC Serving It Right is required prior to serving alcohol in a licensed facility in British Columbia.
- 3 All costs associated with the above are the responsibility of the student.
