

# Important information about ESL

To ensure you enroll in the appropriate level of ESL, you must first complete a placement test to determine your levels of comprehension and writing. You can find the placement test time and location on the program outline below.

#### **Program Outline**

**FUNDAMENTAL - ESL 060** 

Vocabulary building, pronunciation and conversation. Reading and writing are also taught.

#### INTERMEDIATE - ESL 070, 071, 072 AND 073

Core courses include grammar, listening and speaking, reading and writing.

#### ADVANCED- ESL 090, 091, 092, 093 + 1UT COURSE

Core courses include listening and speaking, reading, writing and grammar. At this level, students may take one university level course at no additional charge.

#### EAP - ESL 095, 096, 097 + 2UT COURSES

Core courses include college level writing, reading, listening and speaking. At this level, student may take two university level courses at no additional charge.

#### Grading system

# Important information Post-Diploma & UT Students

## Extending your study permit or visa

- 1 Register for future semester to show the government your study plan.
- 2 Request an enrolment letter for applying student visa or study permit.
- 3 Have a scanned copy of your passport and study permit.
- 4 Have a scanned copy of your proof of financial support document.
- 5 Have a digital passport photo.

## Working off-campus

Non-ESL international students with full-time registration status and a valid study permit are eligible to work in Canada, with some conditions. You can work up to 20 hours per week during the academic year (either on- or off-campus). During college-sanctioned breaks (such as winter or summer holidays, and Reading Week) you may work full time (up to 40 hours per week).

A cumulative Grade Point Average (GPA) is a calculation of the average of all of a student's grades for all courses completed so far.

# Things you need to know

## Medical Insurance for International Students

#### Why health insurance?

• Without health insurance, medical costs in BC are very expensive.

#### Your coverage explained - Guard.me

- For the first three months of your stay in Prince George, Guard.Me is your temporary insurance provider www.guard.me. This insurance is mandatory.
- If you require treatment, visit the Wellness Centre at CNC, Salveo Medical Clinic at Superstore or Nechako Medical Clinic at Spruceland Mall.
- Any pre-existing health conditions you arrived in Canada with may not be covered.
- · Dental coverage is not provided.
- Your Guard.Me Insurance is covered in your deposit fees so no further payment is required.



- Make sure you carry your temporary card with you at all times.
- If you need a prescription, keep all receipts and fill out the claim form you received with your card or complete online.
- · If you arrived and did not receive your card and policy, please check the student mail area in the INET office in a few days.
- Guard.Me will not cover any costs incurred at a private health care facility.

#### Medical Services Plan (MSP)

- Medical Services Plan (MSP) becomes effective approximately three months after you arrive in BC. It is mandatory for all International students and residents of British Columbia.
- We will help you enroll in the MSP program (providing you have a Valid Study Permit and intend on studying at CNC for six months or longer).
- The month you arrive counts as the first of your waiting period regardless of whether you arrive at the start or end of the month. You may notice you have an overlap of coverage from both Guard.Me and MSP for a short period but this is unavoidable.
- You will be billed each month for Health Insurance. You can pay at any bank or BC Access Centre. The College cannot accept payments on your behalf.
- Visit Health Services BC www.hibc.gov.bc.ca to change your address.
- · MSP does not cover the cost of prescriptions or dental expenses.
- If you leave BC for six months or less you must continue to pay your MSP bills.
- Your Care Card is very valuable. Carry it with you at all times. If you need to visit a Health Clinic you will be asked to provide it. Otherwise, you will have to pay.
- Students are not permitted to share cards. It is against the law to do so.

# Retrieving your CNC Connect username and or password

- 1 Go to CNC homepage cnc.bc.ca
- 2 Click on the "CNC Connect" button in the left side bar
- 3 Click the "Account/Password Info" button
- 4 Enter your last name and student number then click "Find"
  - if you do not know your student ID phone 250 562 2131
- 5 Your username will be displayed, be sure to write this down for future use. Once you have your username proceed with the password.
  - if you receive an error message "Account Information not Found", contact the IT Helpdesk at 250 561 5812 or helpdesk@cnc.bc.ca.
  - If you are attempting to reset your password and the email address is not current, contact the Office of the Registrar at **250 562 2131** to have your record updated.


