CNC offers the first two years of courses. Students then transfer to a university to finish their degree. Transfer students with 27-30 credits do not need TOEFL results to be accepted to most Canadian universities.

Admission Requirements

Applicants require proof of successful completion of the following:

- High school, or the equivalent of BC Grade 12 with English 12 minimum "C" grade.
- Minimum TOEFL score of 80 (IBT) or minimum overall IELTS score of 6.0 or equivalent, or completion of CNC ESL English for Academic Purposes
