Library Services are provided to staff and physicians across the Northern Health service region. Information and reference services provide support to evidence-informed decision-making for direct and indirect patient care, clinical and organizational education, quality improvement, research, and program planning.

The collection consists of online and print specialized medical books and journals; physician, nursing, and pharmacy point-of-care tools; and a core selection of biomedical research databases. Physical materials are loaned to staff only while some online content is available through interlibrary loan services upon request from a library in the NH region.

## Access

- CNC or UNBC nursing students working onsite (selected services)
- Librarians (public, academic, school) in the region supporting a patron with a health literacy query and requiring information via established loan processes

Use the "Discovery search" box on the library home page to find items in our print and online collections. Resources include books, journals, media and special collections such as Cinema CNC Movies, Job Search, Northern Institute for Resource Studies, Government Documents and Statistics. Online collections include a wealth of e-books and full text journals licensed for College use. Access these at any campus library or lab, or, for CNC users, by login from home.

Services include research assistance, interlibrary loans, and a wide variety of media and graphic services.

Computers, Scanners, Photocopiers, Media equipment, Colour printers, a 3D printer and an Email-Fax machine are available for public use. The public can access the Internet for a half hour free per day.
