#### PROGRAM OVERVIEW

#### **ESL LEVEL PROGRESSION**

1

#### **FUNDAMENTAL ESL**

(15 WEEKS)

Start to build vocabulary, practice speaking English, improve pronunciation, writing and reading skills.

19 hours per week

2

#### INTERMEDIATE ESL

(15 WEEKS)

Build on grammar knowledge, expand writing skills, read more complex material from real world sources and become a more fluent speaker.

21 hours per week

### **ADVANCED ESL**

(15 WEEKS)

Polish grammar and writing skills to prepare for college level writing, listen and comprehend speaking from a variety of sources.

21 hours per week | Plus one university course

# EAP (ENGLISH FOR ACADEMIC PURPOSES)

(15 WEEKS)

Listen to lectures and academic presentations, create presentations, write college level essays, read and critique texts and academic articles.

21 hours per week | Plus two university courses

Upon completion of EAP, proceed to University Transfer, Business or Career Technical Programs.

No TOEFL/IELTS is required after completing English for Academic Purposes.

IELTS scores listed below usually place at the following levels. Final placement is decided by the CNC placement test.

IELTS Score	CNC ESL Level
5.5 with no band lower than 5.0	Level 4
5.0 with no band lower than 4.5	Level 3
4.5 with no band lower than 4.0	Level 2
Under 4.5	Level 1

# **Admission Requirements**

When applying, you may be 17 years old, but you must turn 18 during your first semester of study at CNC.

- To ensure you enroll in the appropriate level of ESL, you must first complete a placement test to determine your levels of comprehension and writing
- An ESL instructor will interview you before program placement is complete

If you wish to continue your studies at the College of New Caledonia after successful completion of your EAP-level ESL, no TOEFL or IELTS is required.
