Dual credit is an opportunity for high school students to begin post-secondary programs and courses while they are still in high school.

Dual credit is an excellent opportunity to earn credits directly towards your high school and post-secondary transcripts, lighten your course load in your first year of university, and even help gain confidence going into your future.

Students interested in taking a dual credit trades program should consult with their high school career counselor to assess eligibility and prerequisites.

Short Courses

Babysitter's Training

Babysitting is an ideal starter job for youth. This course demonstrates basic child care, accident prevention, first aid, and how best to handle emergency situations. This program is based on the Red Cross Youth Society curriculum. Students must be 12 years of age or older.

CEFA 116

8 HOURS

Home Alone

Keep your children safe when home alone. The Home Alone course is designed to provide children the necessary skills and knowledge to be safe and responsible when home alone for short periods of time. It will help them understand how to prevent problems, handle real-life situations, stay safe and constructively occupied. The course material covers such topics as establishing a routine, house key is your responsibility, strangers, telephone, emergencies, basic first aid, and internet safety.

4 HOURS



Professional Development Courses

Foodsafe Level 1

Upgrade your skills or renew your certification. This course will ensure you have the basic skills for safe food handling & preparation. Topics include foodborne illness, personal hygiene and health, serving and dispensing, protecting and preparing food, receiving and storing food safely, dishwashing methods, and types of germs and diseases.

CEFO 161	7 HOURS
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MarketSafe

Upgrade your skills or renew your certification. MarketSafe is for farmers, food processors and producers who make, bake, or grow products to sell at local farmers' markets, farm gates, or other types of temporary food markets.

CEFO 161	7 HOURS
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Occupational First Aid Level 1

You will be confident in a medical emergency with top quality training. This WorkSafeBC class provides training in basic first aid skills including: AED, C-spine control, respiratory and circulatory emergencies, minor soft tissue injuries, accurate completion of the required documentation, as well as new modules on the identification and management of stroke, diabetes, seizures and fainting. Certificates valid for 3 years.

CEFA 114	8 HOURS
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Occupational First Aid Transportation Endorsement

An excellent supplemental course to OFA Level 1. Amplify your first aid skills with Transportation Endorsement. This course focuses on the transportation of injured workers to medical aid and is an excellent supplemental course for those with OFA Level 1. Certificates valid for 3 years.

CEAB 165	8 HOURS
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Occupational First Aid Level 3

This 70-hour comprehensive course is offered with the objectives of qualifying candidates by WorkSafeBC as first aid attendants in industry. Instruction will be provided in both theory and practical applications. Topics include anatomy and physiology, injury and body response, resuscitation, and new procedures in patient care.

CEFA 125

70 HOURS; 2 WEEKS

Basic Fire Suppression and Safety (S100/S185)

Get ahead of the fire! Upon successful completion of this course, participants will demonstrate a basic knowledge of the wildland fire environment, suppression and safety procedures, as well as an understanding of equipment used in British Columbia to effectively and safely prevent or respond to basic wildland fire.

CEFR 180

16 HOURS

Chainsaw Level 1 Basics Course

This course covers topics such as basic, personal, and worksite safety, worksite safety requirements and practices, chainsaws and other equipment, limbing and tapping practices, and bucking practices. This course can be taught by itself or with a brush saw add-on.

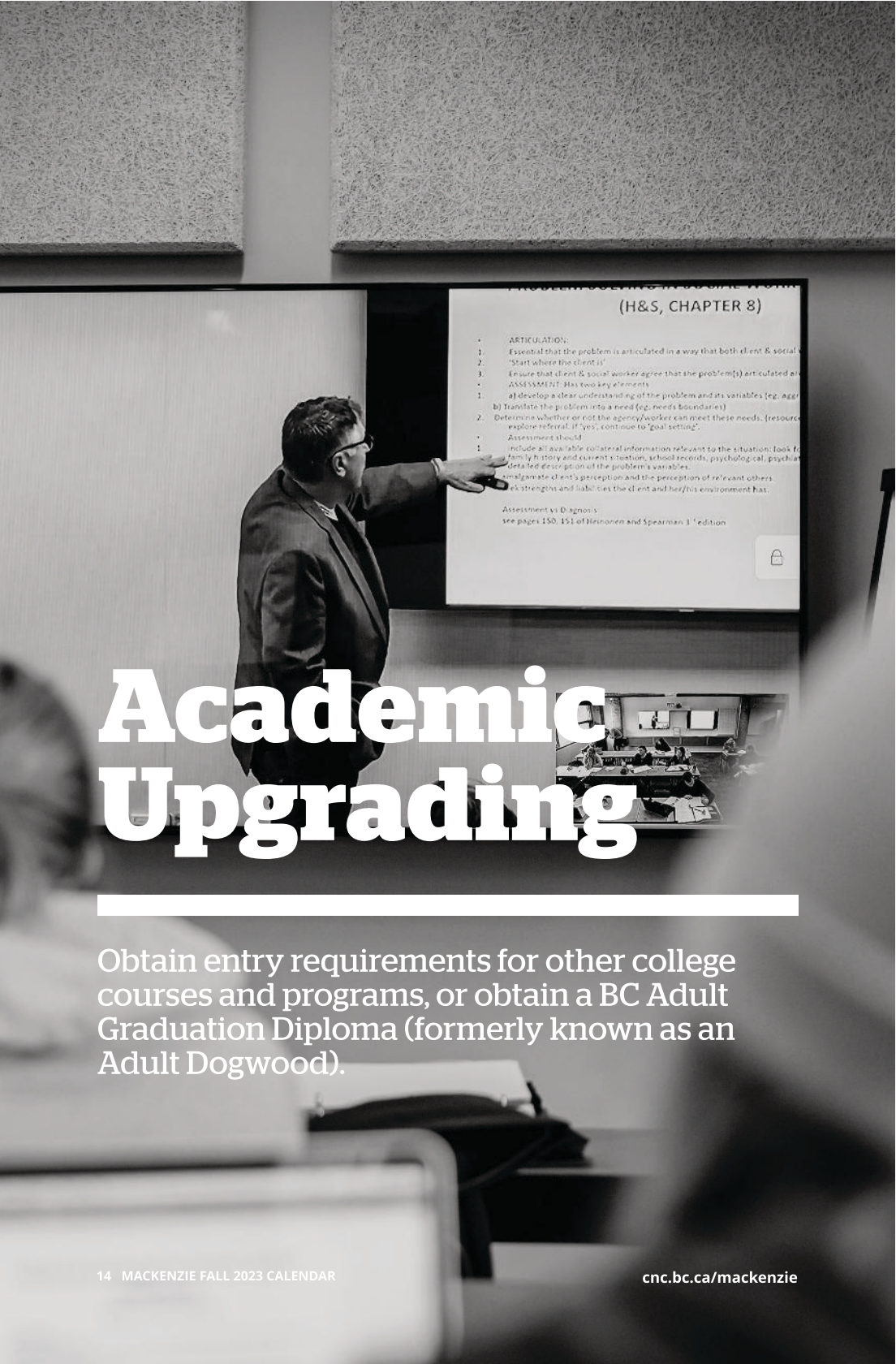

English Language Program

Our English Language Program (ENLA) helps students improve their reading, writing, listening, and speaking English skills.

ENLA has four levels, and each level has three courses. Learning a new language takes a different amount of time for everyone. It is possible for a person to take two years to complete all of the courses at all the levels, but some students can skip the first or second level because of their strong English skills. The ENLA program is run by teachers with many years of English language teaching experience.

ENLA students come from all over the world.

English Language classes help students reach their future goals and can provide paths to other programs at CNC.

Tuition Free

Domestic Students, Permanent Residents, and Refugees can take advantage of free tuition for the English Language Program. Some student fees still apply. To help out with your student fees, see if you are eligible for the Adult Upgrading Grant.
