Step 1

Apply to a Health Care Support Worker - Home Care/Community position at Northern Health's external employment page. Look under the job category: Support Services – Healthcare Support Worker Training Opportunities. If no external postings are currently up, email HCAP@northernhealth.ca. Once you receive and accept your offer of employment, work and training will begin.

Step 2

You will complete an orientation several weeks before school starts. You will attend school full time until graduation.

Step 3

After successfully completing your education, you will complete your return of service agreement with Northern Health in the community where you trained.

Become a Registered Nurse by enrolling in the Northern Collaborative Baccalaureate Nursing Program (NCBNP) at CNC Quesnel. This program is offered in collaboration with partner institutions. The NCBNP is a four-year degree program that consists of 136 credits with 95 required credits in nursing.

Upon completion of this program, you will receive a Bachelor of Science in Nursing (BScN) degree granted by UNBC. Graduates qualify to write the National Council Licensure Exam (NCLEX-RN) and to register with the British Columbia College of Nurses and Midwives (BCCNM).

Entry Requirements

- UNBC admission requirements with a minimum 70% average; and
- Completion of the equivalent of the BC secondary school courses with a minimum 70% in each course:
 - one of Foundations of Mathematics 11 or Pre-Calculus 11 or Principles of Math 11 or equivalent
 - Chemistry 11
 - one of English Studies 12, English 12, or English First Peoples 12
- Completion of the equivalent of Anatomy and Physiology 12 or Biology 12 with a minimum 73% within five years prior to the semester of admission to the NCBNP.

Do you want to develop a foundation for a satisfying and creative career as a carpenter? Learn to create a building from the ground up. As a carpenter, you can work in the residential, commercial, light industrial or heavy construction fields, doing new construction, renovations, or maintenance. As well, you can go on to become a supervisor, building inspector, site superintendent, and more.

This foundation program will provide entry level practical skills and academic knowledge to prepare you to begin your apprenticeship pathway as a Carpenter. You do not need an employer sponsor to participate. In fact, one of the main reasons to complete a foundation program is to gain experience and familiarity with the trade, giving you a competitive advantage to finding an employer to hire you as their apprentice.

Entry Requirements

- English 10 or Communications 11 or equivalent with a “C” or higher
- Foundation Math and Pre-Calculus 10; or a "C" or higher grade in one of the following: Apprenticeship and Workplace Math 11 or Trades Math 041 or Math 030

Carpenter Apprentice Program

CNC Quesnel offers all four levels of technical training:

- Level 1 (7 weeks) *
- Level 2 (7 weeks)
- Level 3 (7 weeks)
- Level 4 (7 weeks) + Red Seal Exam

*You may also receive credit for Level 1 by successfully completing the Carpentry Foundation Program.

Technical training must be completed in sequence. It is recommended to complete a full year of work based training hours between levels to best prepare for the next level of technical training.

Do you have an interest in understanding how to maintain and repair industrial machinery? Become an Industrial Mechanic with this foundation program. The Industrial Mechanic (Millwright)/Machinist Foundation program prepares you for two different trades:

- Industrial Mechanic (Millwright)
- Machinist

As a millwright or a machinist, you will maintain, install, and repair stationary industrial equipment in factories, mills, mines, production plants, and recreational facilities. You will be skilled in using lathes, milling machines, grinders, and other equipment to machine parts to accurate dimensions. As a millwright or machinist, you will work in close association with instrument mechanics, pipefitters, welders, electricians, and heavy equipment mechanics.

Entry Requirements

- Successful completion of English 10, or English 030, or Communications 11, or equivalent
- Successful completion of Foundations Math and Pre-Calculus 10 or Math 030; or a "C" or higher grade in one of the following: Apprenticeship and Workplace Math 11 or Trades Math 041

CNC Quesnel offers all four levels of technical training:

- Level 2 (7 weeks)
- Level 3 (7 weeks)
- Level 4 (7 weeks) + Red Seal Exam

Technical training must be completed in sequence. It is recommended to complete a full year of work based training hours between levels to best prepare for the next level of technical training.

*You may also receive credit for Level 1 by successfully completing the Industrial Mechanic (Millwright)/Machinist Foundation Program.

Entry Requirements

Once your employer has submitted an Apprentice and Sponsor Registration Form to Skilled Trades BC on your behalf, you can apply to attend technical training at CNC. Many of our apprenticeship programs have waitlists, so we encourage you to apply early.

Skilled Trades BC doesn't require Industrial Mechanic apprentices to have completed a required number of work-based-training hours to attend technical training. However, because apprenticeship programs are a unique blend of in-class and on-the-job training, we encourage you to work with your employer to decide on a schedule that best combines these two forms of training.

ABST 150: Conversational Carrier

This course is designed for students who have no knowledge of the Carrier/Yinka Dene language. Participants are introduced to the Carrier language, spoken and written, with an emphasis on basic conversation and culturally important vocabulary and phrases. Through lecture and lab work, participants will have an understanding of basic level Carrier and be able to create simple sentences.

ABST 250: Carrier Language & Grammar Level 1

In this course, students are introduced to the spoken and written Carrier language, including pronunciation, basic conversation, and culturally important vocabulary. Considerable emphasis is placed on grammar, so that the student will learn to produce and understand utterances beyond memorized rituals. The Carrier Linguistic Committee (CLC) writing system will be used.

We offer dozens of university level courses. A bachelor’s degree (also known as an undergraduate degree) usually takes four years. You can take the first two years at CNC, then transfer to university for years 3 and 4. Advantages of starting at a community college include smaller classes, more one-on-one attention from instructors, more access to lab spaces and equipment, and lower tuition fees.

University transfer information (BCCAT)

Students planning to transfer their credits to another institution should consult the British Columbia Transfer Guide to verify transferability of credits. The British Columbia Transfer Guide is published by the British Columbia Council on Admissions and Transfer and is available online.

CNC advisors will assist students in selecting transferable courses; however, the final responsibility for course selection rests with the student. The British Columbia Council on Admissions and Transfer (BCCAT) website is located at www.bctransferguide.ca

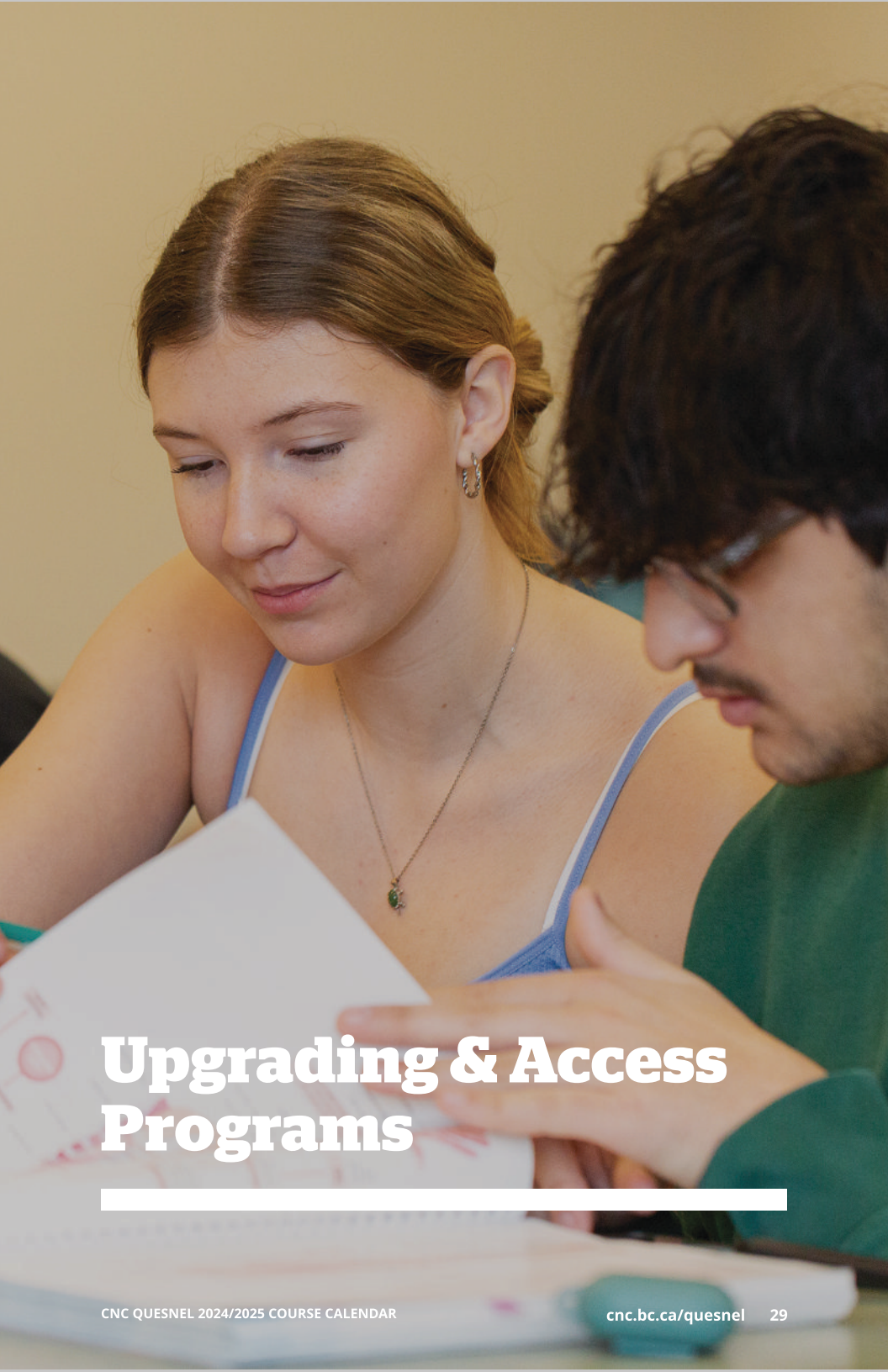

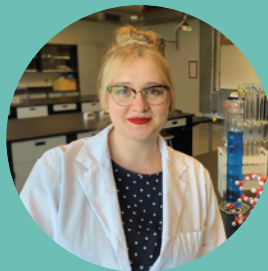
