



Legacy Funding Supporting Enhancement of Historic Trail system in the Cariboo Mountain Ranges

The Fraser Headwaters Alliance was founded in 1998 as a conservation group to protect and conserve the headwaters of the Fraser River and the surrounding environment. With important and often rare flora and fauna species existing within the headwaters of the Fraser River, the Fraser Headwaters Alliance promotes ecosystem health and ecological sustainability for communities in the area. In doing so the Alliance has been involved in many environmental enhancement projects, and a most recent project is upgrading the Historical Goat River Trail that dates back to the Cariboo Gold Rush times in 1886.

With the support from the CNC Research Forest Society Legacy Fund, the Fraser Headwaters Alliance proposes to improve the Goat River Trail in the summer of 2022, this includes:

- clear trail walkways, removing any deadfall;
- reroute sections of the trail to prevent erosion and provide safe passage;
- fix wash-outs caused by stream flooding or avalanches;
- provide and install signage and trail markers;
- build boardwalks;
- install a campsite at Kruger Mountain; and
- improve trail bed and camping areas.
